Gusher Days this year is going to be one of the best ever with more to do than you can shake a stick at. (Another cliché) The day starts off on Saturday morning with booths opening at 8:00. We are anticipating a record number of food and craft booths than we have ever had even one from Mobile Alabama. If you want to rent a booth space(s) call James Clifton, the City Hall or check out the Gusher Day web site www.gusherdays.org. The web site has tons of information and all the forms you need to enter the parade, pageant, and car show or booth information. This year the Town of Oil City and Gusher Days have contracted with the U.S. Lawn Mower Racing Association. Our Lawnmower race this year has a national sponsor, STA-Bill and two local sponsors, Allen Brothers and ROTARY Club. It is a national point's race with 19 different racing divisions. We will have two races on Gusher Day, one at 11:00 and one at 4:00. The races are free but make sure to bring a lawn chair because of limited seating on the belchers and chairs, qualifying starts and hour before each race.

CADDO PARISH FIRE DISTICT 7 CHIEF DANNY RICHARDSON

On April 21 the voters of Fire District Seven will be asked to approve the 10 year, 10 mill property tax **renewal** for hiring full time firefighters and paying salaries and related benefits, together with providing an allowance for uniforms and equipment.

This is a **renewal** of the property tax which allowed the Fire Department to hire full time firefighters for our area. Last year alone, Fire

District Seven responded to 1302 calls. While 309 of those calls were fire related, 605 of the calls were EMS/Rescue calls. As the work progresses on I-49 and the widening of Hwy 1 more of those types of calls are anticipated.

The Board, Chief Richardson and the firefighters have worked very hard to update equipment and provide the fire district with services that benefit our area. We received a reduction in our PIAL rating this year which reduced the amount of your homeowners insurance. We are working additionally to obtain new equipment which will further increase our chances of an additional change in the rating and lower your insurance even more.

As our district was ravished by the wild fires during the summer last year, our fire department saved every inhabited dwelling in their paths. The dedication of each and every firefighter and volunteer was and still remains in each and every one of our minds. We would have seen much more devastation had those individuals not had the equipment, education and determination that our area was not going to lose any lives, homes or schools to the fires. Enough cannot be said about our firefighters.

We ask that you go to the polls on April 21 and continue the services of Fire District Seven by approving the **rededication** of the 10 mill property tax. If you have any questions or concerns please contact Chief Danny Richardson at 995-7114. We once again thank you for all the donations and support for our district.

LA. GREATER CADDO LAKE ASSOCIATION

The Louisiana Greater Caddo Lake Association is asked all the time what do we do. I can give you a couple very good answers. The Louisiana Wildlife

and Fisheries joined with Texas Parks and Wildlife to create a single set of regulation to cover all of Cadde Lake from the dam to the highway 43 bridge. These regulations are unique to Caddo Lake. No other body of water in Louisiana has these exact regulations. Louisiana WLF came to La. GCLA and asked if we could help with the cost of the new signs to go at all the boat ramps. La. GCLA responded by not only helping with the cost, but with the help of Caddo Parish Parks and Recreations had the signs made and installed. We were able to do all this at a cost well below any estimate the La. WLF was able to get. La. GCLA is proud to be able to work with La. WLF on any projects to help Caddo Lake.

The next example of what we do is a project that is just beginning. We will be working with Caddo Lake Institute to create Digital world of Caddo Lake. The main idea is to create a web site for multiple organizations and the general public to see what is being done on the lake to fight aquatic vegetation. The sight will be extremely informative and up to date with all the information on chemical and biological controls being used and what areas are being treated. The general public will be able to access all this information as well as comment or report infestations. There are many ideas that are being considered including adding a historical archive where anyone can click on the map and type in a historical event in that location. When someone clicks on that spot they will be able to pull up that historical event. There will be pictures and more than I have room to list. Please stay tuned for more happening details. It is right now. My last article addressed the use of YO YO's on the lake. To my surprised I got some feed back and saw some results on the lake. I would like to address another problem. This is for bass fishermen for the most part. It involves old fishing line. When you lose a bait in the top of a tree and end up breaking it off, please try to retrieve as much of the line as possible and take it back to the bank to go in the trash. When you leave it in the tree or throw it in the water it becomes a death trap to birds and fish. It also gets rapped on trolling motors and outboard props causing expensive damage. It takes very little effort to put it in your pocket and throw it away when you get off the lake.

Gypsy Damaris Boston Is A Legend by Sarah Hudson Pierce

I have been blest to have a few really good friends in my lifetime! Gypsy Damaris Boston is one of my best! I got to know Gypsy back in 1987 when I received a note from her after she read some of my writing. Gypsy has quite a legacy and I want to write a tribute for her because she has touched my life in so many ways.

I must let you know that she broke her hip on March 6, 2012, at the age of ninety-two, while raking her leaves in her front yard in Ida, La. Now Gypsy has had the same surgery that her mom did after a fall while raking leaves at Gypsy's home in Shreveport at the age of one hundred six. Her mother lived with Gypsy until she was one hundred and ten. Now isn't that a coincidence or

what? Maybe it tells us something about genetics! Whatever! I love Gypsy! Who wouldn't?

She is a great story teller and author of children's books, one of which was recently translated into Chinese. She is of course a prolific writer but she got a good start. She now lives in Ida, La. where she grew up. The house where she now lives in was once the old Ida school house. In fact her dining room used to be the classroom for third graders at one end of the room and fourth graders at the other end. On the first day of school she sat by accident in the fourth grade end instead of the third grade end where she belonged. By the time the mistake was caught she was doing so well that she was left in that class to go on to graduate from high school at the age of fifteen!

She doesn't put on airs either! Gypsy is herself. There's so much to tell! I want to include everything I can! She is a survivor!!! She is an encourager!! She loves watching others succeed almost as much as herself! Her children say that she was always telling them stories as children that had a moral. This is the kind of teaching where children learn without realizing they are being taught. Her son, Frank, writes stories for publication much like his mom. Gypsy's mother, Hermoine Gypsy Bell Petty, was also a well known artist in the Shreveport area and a gifted piano teacher. The story does not stop here!

Her legend dates back to Gypsy's fifth removed great grandmother, Mary Draper Ingles, who was captured by the Indians in July, 1755, by a band of Shawnee warriors who raided Draper's Meadow, a pioneer settlement near modern day Blacksburg, Virginia. Mary saw her own mother killed. Her two young sons were taken away from her and she was taken far into the uncharted American wilderness to a place west of modern day She eventually escaped with Cincinnati, Ohio. known as the "Dutch another woman Woman".. Because she couldn't swim, she had to follow the rivers traveling about 500-600 miles to get back home. It took her about 50 days to get home. When the neighbors found her crawling on the ground they hardly recognized her and picked her up and carried her home where she was reunited with her husband. Note: After 15 years of searching one of her boys was found and brought back from the Indians. She gave birth to five more children. She seldom left the cabin during the rest of her life.

There was also a television movie made of her life back in 1994 and I was awed by the character who played Mary! She said so many of the things I've heard Gypsy say like "it's just too pretty a day not to be happy!" Gypsy has told me this story so many times I almost know it by heart!

Family stories need to be repeated as part of the family legacy or the legends will be lost. Gypsy has been good for me!






